BISHOP McAULIFFE ANNIVERSARY

This Saturday, January 9 marks the anniversary of the peaceful death of Bishop Michael Francis McAuliffe who served here from 1969 to 1997 as our second Bishop. He was a priest of Kansas City, MO when appointed here by Pope Paul VI at the age of 48. He was the first Bishop ordained in this Diocese as Bishop Marling had been an Auxiliary Bishop beforehand. Bishop McAuliffe was responsible for many pastoral and social activities and we pray God will grant him eternal rest and peace.

AMERICANS ARE SLOWLY BECOMING LESS AND LESS RELIGIOUS

Americans are slowly losing their religion, according to an annual poll released during Christmas. The number of adults who do not affiliate with any faith has increased over time, to 19.6% up from 14.6% in 2008, Gallup pollsters found. The United States remains a majority-Christian nation, with 75.2% of American adults identifying themselves as Protestant, Catholic, Mormon or of nondenominational Christian faith, according to the poll. In 2008, 80.1% of Americans said they considered themselves Christian. That figure has been slowly declining since then—to 80% in 2009, 79.1% in 2010, 77.9% in 2011, 77.3% in 2012, 76.8% in 2013, and 75.7% last year. Not surprisingly, older Americans are the ones most likely to call themselves Christians. Every age group from 50-54 and up registered at least 81% as self-identified Christian. But it goes down from there, with the 45-49 set at 79% Christian, 40-44 at 74%, 35-39 at 71%, 30-34 at 67%, 25-29 at 62%, and 18-24 at 62%.


