#### WHY WE EAT FISH ON LENT FRIDAYS?

If you are a Catholic who lives your faith in public (as every Catholic should), you are likely to be asked this week a questions along these lines: Why do you eat fish but not meat? Or, perhaps, you may be asked this question: Isn't fish a kind of meat? Unfortunately, many Catholics do not know how to adequately answer these questions. The reason comes from the *Liber Festivalis*, of the late fifteenth century:

"For when God, for Adam's sin, cursed the earth and the land, he cursed not the water; wherefore it is lawful for a man to eat in Lent that which cometh out of the water."

Catholics, then, are allowed to eat fish because it is a sign of God's mercy.

## CALIFORNIA PILGRIMAGE 2016

Monsignor Kurwicki offers you the wonderful opportunity to be a part of a unique experience here in the United States this summer. Over the years people have mentioned fears about traveling overseas so he has organized a trip during which we will begin in San Diego and conclude in San Francisco. The dates are **June 20—29**.

June 20 Flight: Southwest 2394 (non-stop) St. Louis / San Diego 3:05 PM / 4:50 PM

**MONDAY, JUNE 20** – We begin our California Mission Journey in beautiful, sunny San Diego on the Pacific Coast in Southern California. After settling into our hotel in the Old Town Historic District, our home for the next two nights, we will have a special welcome dinner.

**TUESAY, JUNE 21** – After breakfast, we stroll down to nearby Presidio Park, the Plymouth Rock of the Pacific. Newly Canonized St. Junipero Serra. Where better to begin than the "Mother of the California Missions," Mission San Diego de Alcala, the first link in a chain of 21 missions founded by Father Serra. Then it's on to La Jolla, "the Jewel," to have lunch in this beautiful hideaway just north of San Diego. At the end of the day, we drive along picturesque Mission Bay to San Diego's Embarcadero, where we can choose from the many excellent restaurants for dinner on our own.

**WEDNESDAY, JUNE 22** – This morning our first stop is Oceanside, a pretty coastal community. After Mass at Mission San Luis Rey de Francia (1798), we continue on to the Msssion San Juan Capistrano (1776). After time for lunch on our own, we will travel to Yorba Linda to visit and tour the President Nixon Presidential Library. Then we check in to our hotel in nearby Anaheim, and there have dinner and overnight.

**THURSDAY, JUNE 23** – Today we head for Simi Valley to visit and tour the Presidential Library of President Ronald Reagan. After time for lunch on our own, our destination is "Queen of the Missions". There we celebrate Holy Mass and then check-in at our hotel. We will have the pleasure to dine at a popular restaurant with some beautiful views.

**FRIDAY, JUNE 24** – This morning we will travel to the quaint Danish town of Solvang in the Santa Ines Valley. The "Hidden Gem of the Missions," featuring a museum housing Latin missals, music books on parchment, and early vestments that outdate the mission itself. Our celebration of Holy Mass, begins our reflection and exploration of this Mission. Lunch on our own will complete our morning. In early afternoon we will return to Santa Barbara for some free time, and have dinner together and overnight stay.

**SATURDAY, JUNE 25** – Today we begin with Mission San Luis Obispo de Tolosa (1772), the "Prince of Missions." We continue north to San Miguel and stop to celebrate Mass at the Mission San Miguel Archangel (1797). On our journey further to the north we first make a stop so that we can have a bite of lunch on our own. Then we drive some distance to the beautiful Monterey Peninsula. We check in at our hotel in Monterey and go for dinner on our own at the marvelous sea-front area of Carmel-by-the-Sea. In this beautiful setting we can select from the many award-winning restaurants

**SUNDAY, JUNE 26** – Today we begin at the Mission San Carlos Borromeo del Rio Carmelo (Carmel Mission - 1770), the final resting place of St. Junipero Serra. After Mass, we will take a driving tour with stops for lunch on our own, as well as photo taking at the breathtaking 17 Mile Drive, seeing Bird and Seal Rocks, Lone Cypress and Pebble Beach. We can relax back at the hotel before being taken to the Rappa's Restaurant in Monterey for dinner.

**MONDAY, JUNE 27** – This morning's drive takes us north through the gorgeous Salinas Valley where we stop to celebrate Mass at Mission San Juan Bautista. After Mass we visit San Juan Bautista State Historic Park, which includes the old Plaza Hotel, site of the 1840 Castro House, headquarters of the Mexican government. Following lunch on our own, we continue north through the world famous Silicon Valley to the Mission Santa Clara de Asis (1777), located on the banks of the Guadalupe River. Our day will wind up in San Francisco, where we will enjoy this lovely city's hospitality for the next two nights. We check in at our hotel and are served dinner.

**TUESDAY, JUNE 28** – We start thus final full day with Mass at Mission Dolores (1776), founded in honor of Our Lady of Sorrows and Saint Francis of Assisi, its official patron. We are given the grand tour of San Francisco, featuring the Twin Peaks observation site, Nob Hill, Chinatown, St. Mary's Cathedral and the downtown area. After time for lunch on our own, we are treated to another view at Golden Gate Bridge Outlook. Then we descend to the docks at San Francisco Bay. We will board a ferry for a ride to the middle of the bay to Alcatraz. We return by ferry, and then we enjoy our last evening in San Francisco at dinner at Fog Harbor Fish Restaurant.

WEDNESDAY, JUNE 29 –We have breakfast and check out of our hotel to head for San Francisco International Airport for our flight home.
