GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY: A VOCATION ANGLE

First Reading: Acts 2:14, 36-41

When Peter address the crowd, "they were cut to the heart." Sometimes the Holy Spirit speaks to us through a moment of clarity deep in our spirit. Many men who have been called to the priesthood have had this experience—during Mass, on a retreat, or at a youth event. The question is, how do you respond? Will you be like those in the crowd that day, who responded whole-heartedly to the call?

Psalm: Psalm 23

When a young person feels called to the priesthood or religious life, he or she can experience a lot of confusion and anxiety. But the saints tell us <u>never to make a decision about one's vocation in a state of fear.</u> Rather, like the psalmist, we must learn to discover a place of inner peace, where we hear Jesus best, and then trustingly respond to His call.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:20-25

When faced with the choice of marriage and family or priesthood and religious life, people are drawn to the former by their very natures. Sometimes, though, sacrifices should be made for the sake of a great good. Like Jesus, some are called to celibacy for the Kingdom of God.

Gospel: John 10:1-10

To hear the Shepherd's voice requires quiet and prayer. Pope Saint John Paul II said, "Young people, if they can be taught how to pray, can be trusted to know what to do with God's call." Preach about prayer, methods of prayer, and the importance of listening for God's voice, especially when making big decisions in life.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Shepherds and sheep were so much a part of life for Jesus and those from Galilee. Galilee was, after all, largely a rural area and raising sheep and sheepherding was an intricate part of their lives. That is why the image of a shepherd with his sheep was so often used during biblical times. It was a connection with which people could identify. It is equally important for us today to understand this important cultural connection for them. Shepherding was all about feeding the lambs and the sheep (recall that Jesus tells Peter "Feed my sheep."), bringing them to good pasture lands and water ("The Lord is my shepherd...He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside quiet waters; he restores my soul."); going after lost lambs ("Does he not leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it?"); and protects the sheep in the field and the fold ("The watchman opens the gate, and the sheep listen to his voice."). Our Gospel reading today comes from St. John 10: 1-10. In St. John 10: 11, the next verse, Christ declares "I am the good shepherd; the good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep." As Catholics and Christians, we, too, are called to be Good Shepherds to all those with whom we come in contact. It may be from another culture than ours, but we should understand full well the implications of that.—catholicsteward.com

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

In case of a weather emergency during Mass, the weather siren will warn the priest of the situation. The priest will then advise the congregation to seek shelter in the undercroft. The ushers shall assist in directing the congregation seeking shelter. Once it is determined to be safe, the congregation will be directed back to the nave of the Cathedral and will be either dismissed or the Mass will be completed, depending on how much time has passed. 
