# STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

The more popular name for today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is "Corpus Christi" which of course in Latin means the "Body of Christ." The Church has celebrated this feast at this time since it was proclaimed by Pope Urban IV in 1264.

We are asked on this day to concentrate on two expressions of the Body of Christ — the Holy Eucharist and the Church itself. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1327) states the importance of the Eucharist quite succinctly and directly: "In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith." At the center of every Mass is our celebration of the Eucharist. The word "Eucharist" comes from the Greek word eucharistia which means "thanksgiving." It is through the Eucharist which we receive the Lord's greatest gift to us, and it should be in thanksgiving and delight which we receive it.

This holy day should also remind us of all those things for which we should be thankful. Gratitude is at the basis of a life of stewardship. It is through thanksgiving for all we have received, especially the Holy Body and Blood of Christ through the Eucharist, that we find the motivation and the commitment to be good stewards.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI in one of his writings spoke of the Eucharist in this way: "In the Eucharist a communion takes place that corresponds to the union of man and woman in marriage. Just as they become 'one flesh,' so in the Eucharist we all become 'one spirit,' one person with Christ." Today we thank God for the incredible gift to us of the Eucharist. -catholicsteward.com

THE VERB by Msgr. Kurwicki

SANCTE It isn't often you see Latin in this bulletin. There are some things, it seems, best said in Latin. Those two words need many more English words to express their full meaning. A good translation might be, "Treat holy things, in a holy way." In other words, we need to keep a basic reverence in our lives as Catholics. Our Holy Father speaks of the beautiful tradition of silence and reverence in Catholic Churches. Most visitors are struck by it immediately. The Pastor remembers years ago a non-Catholic asking about the Tabernacle, the silence, the genuflections in church - - the whole atmosphere. He answered with a brief explanation of Catholic faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament. The visitor answered, "If I believed that, I would crawl in here on my knees." He was right, of course, but the Church has never asked that. She has, however, always insisted on reverence in our churches. Very frankly, we may be losing some of that. The fear stems from the conduct, thoughtless apparently, of some clergy and laity in the presence of the Most Blessed Sacrament. May we therefore, join Pope Francis in recalling to everyone in this parish, some of the beautiful, traditional Catholic reverence we must keep in our Cathedral:

- Turn off your cell phone except for emergency personnel. No texting during Mass.
- The Holy Water Fonts are used before and after Mass with your right hand, this includes children.
- We should genuflect properly on entering and leaving the Cathedral and whenever we pass before the Tabernacle with the right knee. Even if one is late for Mass the genuflection is still required. Children should be taught to genuflect, right knee, please.
- Giving the sign of peace before Holy Communion is highly recommended. But it must be done briefly and reverently. It should never become a noisy hoopla situation.
- A slight bow of the head is to be given before reception of Holy Communion, both Body and Blood of Christ in front of priest or minister, not the person ahead of you.
- We should make a sign of reverence - sign of the cross - after receiving Holy Communion in a standing position. Our clear spoken "Amen" before receiving is also an affirmation of faith.
- Dipping the Sacred Host into the Most Precious Blood is an abuse of the Holy Eucharist. In the U.S. Bishops' 1984 directory entitled *This Holy and Living Sacrifice*, it says "the communicant may never dip the Eucharist Bread into the chalice" (N.52).
- Standing in the back of the Cathedral while Mass is being prayed is unnecessary, unless one is ill. We have many pews, please be seated during the Mass.
- If you must stand in the back, the proper thing to do is kneel when the remainder of the congregation kneels, health permitting.
- Prayers of thanksgiving after Communion are still required and are very special. We should not neglect them.
- Serious or Mortal sin does not permit one to receive the Eucharist until a confession of sins is made. One can ask for a blessing instead of remaining in the pew.
- Small children not having received their First Holy Communion as yet, may approach the priest or Communion Minister with arms folded in adoration.
- Food of any sort is not allowed in the Cathedral. This includes the chewing of gum during Mass. Infants and very small children are a different matter. Never any soda, beer or hard liquor at all in the Cathedral or vestibule, even at wedding rehearsals.
- Pictures of ceremonies are not forbidden, but proper decorum must be maintained. No selfies at Mass please.
- Gentlemen are to wear shirts and remove hats/caps. All should dress appropriately and modestly in the House of God.
- No smoking or gum chewing in Cathedral ever.
- We should not leave Mass early or after Holy Communion unless an emergency or illness.
- When visiting a parish when on vacation or business, please donate when the basket is passed to you.
