SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM BISHOP JOHN R. GAYDOS

Many of you may recall your participation in a diocesan planning process under the direction of the Chancery staff during 2009-10. At that time, Sister Kathleen Wegman, SSND, Chancellor of the Diocese and Ron Vessel, Associate to the Chancellor undertook extensive research within the Local Church to determine the challenges and opportunities facing our Diocese at that time. Using the breadth and depth of that research, they developed four priorities and multiple strategies to address the pastoral areas that emerged during this research phase.

In this week's edition of *The Catholic Missourian* you will find a pastoral letter from me regarding the Pastoral Plan 2010, "Christ's Call ... Our Response." The original plan (2010 - 2015) called for an evaluation of the plan in 2015. My letter outlines briefly the development of the pastoral plan, the evaluation process and how we intend to move forward with future planning.

Elsewhere in *The Catholic Missourian* you will find a more detailed analysis of the planning process in an article titled "Accountability Report and Next Steps, June 2016." I encourage you to take time to read and reflect on the contents of that report and the direction it sets for our immediate future. I count on your personal prayer and participation in parish life in such a way that our response *anew* to Christ's call truly will give further direction and meaning to our lives.
