#### MY CATHOLIC EDUCATION AT ST. JOSEPH CATHEDRAL SCHOOL

The following essay was written by Kelsey McKenna, a recent graduate of the Cathedral School.

After attending St. Joseph's School for only one year, I can tell you that it's been a significant change. The amount of energy and faith in the people at this school is overwhelming. Coming from a public school, where religion is rarely a topic of conversation, I was in culture shock. Going to adoration, benediction, and stations of the cross was all completely new. I've learned quite a bit, and I don't just mean algebra formulas. This school has shaped my faith, knowledge, and service.

My faith has been entirely re-molded. Growing up, I went to Sunday school and said my prayers, but only because I had to. It was a chore; just like feeding my dog or taking out the trash. I never gave much thought to it. The teachers had seen this, and told me that I'd feel differently after my first confession. Walking into the confessional, the priest was nice, but my hands were shaky and I forgot how to say a Hail Mary. I was absolutely terrified, but I can't even remember why. Coming out of the confessional, I felt worse than going in. When people asked me if I felt better, I said yes, even though I didn't. After my first reconciliation, I decided that I would do what was asked of me; nothing more, nothing less. That mindset led me to stop going to Sunday school and mass almost completely. Once I found out that I would be going to a Catholic school, I was not pleased. First of all, I was moving halfway across the country where I knew nothing and no one. Secondly, it was a religious school! I had lots of questions. Do people act differently there? Why do we have to wear uniforms? Everyone's known each for their entire lives, where do I fit in? These worries kept me up half the night before the first day of school. While I was walking in, the anticipation was killing me. I expected people to act like a scene from Mean Girls, but they didn't. People were warm and welcoming and opened my mind to being a Disciple of Christ. I was taught with an entirely different approach and now have the love of God in my heart.

Through this new appreciation for Christ, I've gained knowledge that I never would have had before. They say that knowledge is power, and I agree. Knowing and understanding as much as you can puts you in control of your life. Knowledge is not only memorizing facts and vocabulary from a textbook, it is understanding a topic that can be used in the real world. I've learned how to be a better person who is responsible, empathetic, and compassionate through the guidance of the staff and my peers here at St. Joseph.

Another aspect of being a better Catholic which I have learned at St. Joseph is service. Before I moved, I never did things like volunteer at the Special Learning Center or go to the animal shelter. It's not because I didn't want to, but it was not an essential part of the culture there, so I didn't think it was all that important. By being surrounded with people who do these types of things, I began to see the value of service, and put more of an emphasis on it in my daily life. Our school also has service opportunities for people who might not do it on their own time. Some examples include the beginning of the year pancake breakfast, picking up trash around the Cathedral, and visiting the Oak Tree Villas. Through these experiences and those of my own, I've gathered the importance of giving back to the community.

The faith, knowledge, and service I've learned from our school will be the foundation for the rest of my life. Having a strong relationship with God, being interested in new things, and giving back to the people who have shaped me are all vital parts of becoming the person God created me to be. St. Joseph's Cathedral School has taught me so much in the short time I've been here, and for that, I cannot thank my teachers and peers enough.

#### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

We are reminded in today's readings that we are human, and that as a result of that we are sinners, and we inherit that sin from the very beginning, from Adam. St. Paul points that out in our Second Reading from Romans 2. Were you aware that in Hebrew the name Adam means "humanity?" In today's Gospel Reading from Matthew, Jesus also reminds us of the fact that we are sinners, but He also prompts us to remember that one of the reasons we sin is because we fear other humans and the consequences of living out our faith more than we fear the Lord Himself. Jesus says, "...do not be afraid of those who kill the body, but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." "Gehenna" is translated in some Bible versions as "Hell." What the Lord is trying to communicate to us may be that we probably tend to fear earthly matters and earthly people more than we fear God. If we are "killed" by someone or something on earth it is the body only which dies. However, shrinking back from God's call can have eternal consequences. "Saving grace" and being saved are probably not thoughts on which we like to dwell, but they are real, and we need to recognize that. St. Alphonsus Liguori wrote, "The saved are few, but we must live with the few if we would be saved with the few. O God, too few indeed they are; yet amongst 5 those few I wish to be." <u>- catholicsteward.com</u>


