We expect the bill to be the same this year. So far we have only collected **\$3,992.00** this year! The remainder will have to be paid from general revenue which takes away from extra social projects and school events. Please help us!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The Ministry of Deacons has become an essential part of our parish life today. Yet for centuries, until 1967, this deeply traditional ministry had virtually disappeared. Every priest had first to be ordained a deacon, but the notion that one could actually embrace a permanent vocation to the diaconate was lost.

The primary ministry of the deacon is to the welfare of the community, especially its poor. His role is sacraments, and preaching flows from that. His principal role is to animate and promote the ministry of all the faithful. Ninety percent of permanent deacons are married, although the discipline of celibacy for clerics means that if a deacon is widowed, normally he cannot remarry, nor can an unmarried deacon marry once ordained. The Deacon does not preside at Mass nor may he absolve sins. Nor, since anointing of the sick is linked theologically to penance, may he anoint.

Sometimes we are slow to engage with a tradition: Trent approved permanent deacons in the 1560s, but nothing was done until the 1960s. The vitality of the long delayed restoration has greatly enriched the Church, particularly in the United States, where the majority of the deacons in the world serve.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Our First Reading from Second Kings, chapter 4, features Elisha. You may recall that Elisha was plowing in a field when the prophet Elijah called him to follow him. Something happened at that moment and Elisha chose to do it, which is what brought him to this point in his journey (as reported in today's Holy Scripture). We often address the fact that each of us is called as well. Our calling, like Elisha's and like those of Christ's Apostles, is really not that much different. Christ said, "Follow Me," and the Apostles basically dropped everything, ceased pursuing what they were doing — in some cases with good jobs and vocations — and followed Christ. We are called to follow the Lord from the moment of our Baptism, but how many of us actually take that calling seriously? It is not just a question of hearing the call; the key is whether we are listening for it? It is there, but we must be aware of it in order to respond. Elisha's call and our calls are signs of God at work. God has a plan for each of us. We are the means by which God's work is continued in our parishes, in our communities, and in the Church. God's ministry on earth will be carried out and accomplished. None of us is the entire ministry; we can all be replaced. However, by the same token in God's eyes we are absolutely necessary. Are we ready to respond? Are we ready to be disciples of the Lord?

A QUIETER CATHEDRAL?

Recently, some former parishioners returned to our parish for a visit with relatives and attended a weekend Masses. They were very complimentary of all aspects of the parish except for one. They indicated that the noise level in the Cathedral after Mass was so great that they had difficulty concentrating as they were saying their prayers after Mass. While this is a large, active Cathedral parish and not a Monastery, we should always be aware that it is a sacred and holy building. We are not desiring complete and total silence. Everyone knows that small children make noise and everyone can be at times careless with the volume of their conversations, but it is important for us to remember that if we need to visit or talk in the Cathedral after daily or weekend Masses, to speak in a hushed or whispered tone.
