

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

In the Parable of the Rich Fool, Jesus said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." (Lk 12:15). Most of the Parables shared by the Lord in Holy Scripture address the issue of possessions and how we treat them, how we use them as a measurement of success. Consistently those who write about the challenges we face in living lives of stewardship point to this same problem. Jesus certainly understood it.

Christ was living in a society that was very different from that we experience today, but that basic difficulty existed then, as it does now. The problem is not that possessions exist, but that they can become the dominant motivation in our lives and how we live them.

The Lord cautions us, as He does in the Parable of the Rich Fool from today's Gospel, that storing up treasure and possessions means that we may be wealthy in the eyes of society, but not in "what matters to God." This is one of our ongoing stumbling blocks to being stewards living a Christian life.

Our Holy Father Pope Francis speaks often about this same problem. In a recent homily he said, "True joy does not come from things or from possessing. It is born from the relationship with others; it is born from feeling accepted, understood, and loved, and from accepting, understanding, and loving. It is saying to one another, 'You are important to me,' not 'What you have is important to me.' Possessions are nothing but an illusion." -catholicsteward.com

THE VERB

It is about Bishops that I write today: August seems to be their month here at our Cathedral.

Our Venerable founder, Bishop Joseph Mary Marling CPPS, who established this parish and built the great Cathedral, was ordained a Bishop, at the age of 42, on August 6, 1947, in Cincinnati, Ohio, by Archbishop John T. McNicholas, OP as the Auxiliary Bishop to Archbishop Edwin V. O'Hara of Kansas City. I only saw Bishop Marling once in my life in 1978. By this time illness and age had taken its toll, yet he still possessed a great dignity. I vividly recall many stories told by our senior prelates and pastors of his intellectual power and missionary zeal. The Bishop retired in 1969 at 64. I only saw him once from a distance in 1978. He died on October 2, 1979 at 75 years of age. May God grant his soul rest.

Bishop Michael Francis McAuliffe was ordained a Bishop at the age of 48, here on August 18, 1969, by Apostolic Delegate. Bishop Marling attended; our link to the past was not broken. Bishop McAuliffe was the first Bishop ever ordained in Jefferson City. He served faithfully until retirement in 1997 at 76. It was an honor to be ordained both a deacon and priest by him in this Cathedral Church. He named me as an associate pastor twice and pastor three times. I also had the pleasure of serving as his Master of Ceremonies for several years. You are able to discover and understand a person, when you travel countless miles over the years to numerous confirmations and other events. He was always a gentleman. I suspect there is always a special bond with the Bishop that ordains you. Bishop McAuliffe passed away on January 9, 2006, at 85 years old. It was an honor to be one of his pall bearers and to serve him until the final hour.. May God grant his soul eternal rest.

Our current Ordinary for the last 18 years, Bishop John Raymond Gaydos, was ordained at the age of 54, here on a very hot August 27, 1997, by Archbishop Justin F. Rigali. Bishop McAuliffe attended, again our link to the past was not broken. I had the privilege of Bishop Gaydo's Master of Ceremonies. As 27 years had passed since the last episcopal ordination and the new Bishop had been a Master of Ceremonies for 13 years, it made for a very full day for me! I was named Pastor here by him in 2004. While it is never prudent to comment on a current Bishop except to say that in Bishop Gaydos, God has given us a true shepherd who cares and loves us by his words and deeds. It is grace to work with him at his Cathedral.

I ask you to join me in prayer for these three prelate during the month of August.

Bishop Marling on August 6, that he will rest in peace. Bishop McAuliffe on August 18, that he will rest in peace. Bishop Gaydos on August 27, that God will bless him.
