STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION -catholicsteward.com

In the Gospel from John, Jesus advises us, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." By calling Himself the Bread of Life, Jesus is telling us by what He says, how He acts, and in fact, Who He is that He is the Word of God made flesh. God reveals to us the Word alive in the most complete way possible through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We are to hear the Word and know Who Jesus is; we are to accept that Word into our minds and hearts — into our spirit — and we are to let that Word begin to change us. That change is represented by knowing what God wants us to do. Today's Holy Scriptures make that clear. We must pray that we respond and be good stewards of our time, talent, and treasure so that we can do the work God wants us to do. In the Second Reading, Paul reminds us that we need to undergo a conversion — in effect, put on a new self. Our entire lives need to be devoted to change, so that we renew ourselves from the inside and live a stewardship way of life according to God's ways. Charles Spurgeon, an English minister in the 1800s once wrote: "Conversion is a turning onto the right road. The next thing to do is to walk on it." That is our trial. Once we experience conversion, we must follow through by doing what the Lord wishes us to do.

Bishop McKnight invites all to pray a special intention each month. This month the intention is **"May the beginning of another school year be a moment of grace for students, teachers, administrators, parents, and supporting parishes and communities to grow in knowledge of all that God provides for our good and the good of all."**

CATHOLIC MISSOURIAN The policy of the Bishop is that every Catholic home in the Diocese should receive the paper; then the Parish is billed for the subscription. Please use the envelope for the Catholic Missouriian that is in your monthly packet to pay your subscription. The cost is \$14 per year. The bill for the Cathedral last year was approximately **\$18,000**. We expect the bill to be the same this year. So far we have only collected **\$4,432.67**. Any remainder will have to be paid from general revenue, which takes away from extra social projects and school events. Please help us!

"They walked beside him as he healed the sick and fed the multitudes. Jesus was their Rabbi, Messiah, Christ, and faithful companion. This time he climbed the mountain beside the three to provide a glimpse of the glory to come. When, then, the sheer magnitude, might, and brilliance of the One with whom they journeyed was revealed, they fell to their faces, afraid.

I, too, bask in the comfort and familiarity, and yet, at the same time, have an overwhelming fear of my Lord. I bow my head low and allow the morning's emerging rays to envelop and warm me. I whisper gratitude as the earth produces its first fruits and I am left in awe as my brave one's eyes speak to mine without words. I know, in these moments and more, it is God's gentle grace that produces gifts which soothe my soul, send bountiful harvests, entrust children into my womb.

And still, with all he has given, he sends his only Son. He sends his Beloved, the human example of whom I am to follow and the glory of which I am called, to be broken, beaten, and hung on a cross for my sins. Who am I that he would offer a sacrifice as great as to give his life for mine? The greatness of the love with which I am loved seeps into my soul and overwhelms me.

And as he did for his disciples, he does for me: he calls gently to my soul and draws my face to his. In this quiet moment I encounter the familiar comforts of my Savior and am reminded that it is with him that I continue to walk."

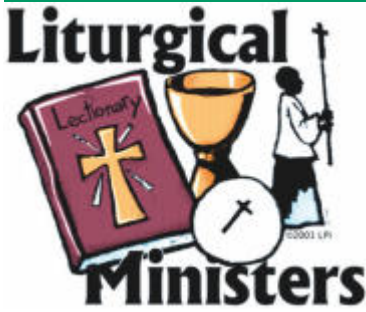

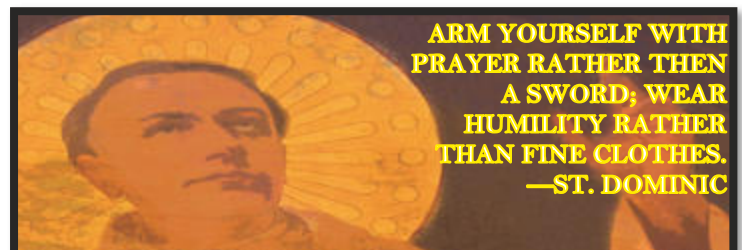
