STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

All the readings on this Sixth Sunday seem to address from one perspective or another the idea of "free will" as it goes hand in hand with "God's wisdom." St. Paul speaks to this ongoing philosophy and discussion of "free will" more than anyone else in Holy Scripture. However, as he points out in our Second Reading from his First Letter to the Corinthians, "We speak God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden, which God predetermined before the ages for our glory." In addition to St. Paul, St. Augustine and St. Thomas Aquinas wrote volumes about the issue of "free will." The point of all of this is that on the one hand we are gifted with free will, but we must accept the reality that making the wrong moral decision has consequences. In our First Reading from the Prophet Sirach, we hear "Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him." That is immediately followed by "Immense is the wisdom of the Lord." We do have choices throughout our lives. One of those choices is pursuing stewardship as a way of life. One can choose to be a steward or choose not to. Nevertheless, if we look at it from the point of view of God's wisdom rather than ours, it really is not a choice at all. It is something we should and must practice. In a homily this past June, Pope Francis said, "You cannot love God without loving your brothers and sisters; in fact, you cannot love God without being an active participant in the Church."

Therefore, during the next few days following March 17th, people are reminded to do some extra work of penance or charity in place of abstaining form meat on St. Patrick's Day

The Roman Army frowned upon marriage as soldiers would second guess their acts of bravery in the light of worrying about their wife and children back home. The cards given out this week on St. Valentine's Day remind us of the bravery of this ancient priest and the Catholic Church's dedication to good, healthy, and fruitful marriages. My special blessing to all in our parish who are married, all who are preparing for this sacrament in the future and to all widows and widowers.



ERODING DIGNITY AT THE END OF LIFE

Colorado is the sixth state to legalize physician-assisted suicide in a November ballot measure. The new las is especially concerning because it neither requires an assessment by a psychiatrist or psychologist nor does it take into account the possibility of misdiagnosis of a patient's condition. Statistics from Quebec support these concerns. There were three times the number of expected assisted suicide deaths with 8% of them being non-compliant with the law. In response, the government has indicated they will weaken the requirements needed. This is a dangerous course. These safeguards are in place to ensure coercion is not occurring and the patient has a second diagnostic opinion. Allowing assisted suicide in limited cases has resulted in the proverbial slippery slope where more situations allow for assisted suicide. In the Netherlands, where assisted suicide has been legal since 2002, a man was recently permitted to be euthanized because he was an alcoholic. One in three Dutch doctors indicated they would be willing to euthanize the mentally ill. In Switzerland, healthy individuals have euthanized solely because they ere elderly or were "losing their looks." Sadly, the Swiss government has refused to investigate or regulate euthanasia in their country. Let us remember the words of St. John Paul II: "Even when not motivated by a selfish refusal to be burdened with the life of someone who is suffering, euthanasia must be called a false mercy, and indeed a 'perversion' of Mercy." - STLRespectLife.org
