

#### **STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION**

The Book of Leviticus from which our First Reading comes is the third book in the Old Testament. Its name in part comes from the Levites, who were the tribe to which Aaron belonged. Historically Aaron is considered to be the one from whom priests are descended. However, the Bible offers instructions to all of us, not just to priests. In today's reading from Leviticus, God says to Moses that he should teach the people this: "Be holy, for I, the LORD, your God, am holy."

There is no way, of course, that we can be as holy as God is. God is divine, not human, and thus His Holiness is above and way beyond our capabilities. What God is saying to us though is that we do need to strive for holiness. We often speak of our call to holiness and how we can try to achieve that. One way is to embrace stewardship and all it entails as a way of life.

Will that make us holy like the Lord? No, but it does mean that we need to comprehend that it is God and God's wisdom we must embrace and follow. Holiness for us means we need to attempt to separate ourselves from those things and thoughts and ideas which can be viewed as not holy in the Eyes of God. Yes, it is impossible for us, but yet that is what we must try to do.

# A NOTE FROM BISHOP GAYDOS

Bishop Gaydos has granted a dispensation to all Roman Catholics who are members of the Diocese from the Lenten observance of abstaining from meat on the Feast of St. Patrick, Lenten Friday, March 17, 2017, for this year only. You will not need to write to him for this request. This dispensation is granted for those who need it. This dispensation does not remove the obligation to maintain their works of penance during the rest of the Lenten season. During the next few days following March 17th, people are reminded to do some extra work of penance or charity in place of abstaining from meat on St. Patrick's Day.

# **OUOTE BY DON BARSOTTI**

The soul that leans on God alone, experiences a peace that transcends all suffering. "We have to remember that man lives in a triple dimension: physical, psychological and spiritual. The dimension of a purely physical life makes us slaves to nature and all its demands: cold, heat, illness, instincts and death. The psychological dimension makes us subset to the highs and lows of feelings and sensations. We are never entirely free. Nevertheless, if we live in the spiritual dimension, the soul transcends itself and reaches God. This is the life of pure faith, which leans on nothing other than God Himself. It is the life of infallible hope, which seeks no other support than in Him. It is a life of boundless charity, which doesn't capitulate when faced with evil. In this dimension, no trial can disturb the soul and take away its innermost peace. It may be a "black" peace as the mystics call it, given that on the physical and psychological levels the soul may experience abandonment and trials, but it doesn't capitulate. It experiences a peace that transcends all suffering".
