THE VERB by Msgr. Kurwicki

On the Second Sunday of Easter of the Jubilee Year 2000, at the Mass for the canonization of St. Faustina Kowalska, St. Pope John Paul II proclaimed to the world that "from now on throughout the Church this Sunday will be called Divine Mercy Sunday".

In the 1930s, Sister Faustina of Poland received from the Lord a message of mercy that she was told to spread throughout the world. She was asked to become the apostle and secretary of God's mercy, a model of how to be merciful to others, and an instrument for reemphasizing God's plan of mercy for the world. The message of mercy that Sister Faustina received is now being spread throughout the world; she has been recognized by the Church as a "Saint"; and her diary, *Divine Mercy in My Soul*, has become the handbook for devotion to The Divine Mercy. She would not have been surprised, for she had been told that the message of God's mercy would spread through her writings for the great benefit of souls.

Through St. Faustina, Jesus also revealed special ways to live out the response to His mercy—one of which is the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, as both a novena and a prayer. Please join us Sunday at 4:30 p.m. in the chapel as we join together to seek God's mercy as we pray together.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION SUNDAY, today is the happiest day of the year in the parish, as 47 of our beautiful young people will receive Jesus Christ's Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity for the very first time in their young lives. We ask the Lord to grant them a strong faith and love in Him ever present in the Eucharist. The patron Saint of First Holy Communion is Blessed Imelda Lambertini, an 11 year old Italian girl who died in 1333 on the day of her First Holy Communion. She exhibited an extremely strong faith and a belief in Jesus in the Eucharist and told her parents her First Communion day, "Can anyone receive Jesus into their heart and not die?' I can easily recall my own First Holy Communion Day, on Thanksgiving Day, November 24, 1966 with 23 classmates, by Monsignor Maurice F. Driscoll in Belleville, Illinois. He taught the prayer, "Jesus, I Adore You and I love You. "Pope Benedict XVI told a First Holy Communion Class in 2005 to remember, "today you begin a life long special friendship with Jesus—a journey together to walk hand and hand with the Savior." Congratulations to our class, their parents, grandparents, god parents, teachers, and families.
