WHAT IS THE GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION?

This week a collection will be taken up throughout the Church at the direction of His Holiness Pope Francis to support the institutions and missions of the Church in the Holy Land. The funds received are forwarded to the Franciscans of the Custody of the Holy Land, who have been caretakers of the holy places for eight centuries.

As so many of the faithful are fleeing the Holy Land and the Middle East generally, our prayerful and financial support is needed more than ever. The funds received in this universal collection are used in many ways to support and strengthen the faithful who remain in the Holy Land.

Last year, for example, the annual collection benefited the faithful in Iraq and Syria in these ways: Supported 29 parishes, four homes, for orphans, three academic institutions: helped keep 16 schools open for over 10,000 pre-K through grade 12 students; funded university scholarships for 295 students; provided 398 homes benefiting Christian Families, and much more. The collection, however, not only benefited Iraq and Syria, but other places in the Holy Land in these ways: in Old City of Jerusalem, 80 homes were renovated for Christian families; senior care facilities were built in both Bethlehem and Nazareth; archeological research was funded at Magdala; and new parish centers were built in Jericho and Cana.

The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, which provides 75% of the annual budget of the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem, one of the principle duties is to contribute both spiritually and financially toward the welfare of the Christians in the Holy Land and toward the holy places in the Holy Land.

We share in the spiritual blessings of the Christians who live in the land where Jesus walked. Therefore, we, too, should be of service to them in material blessings. Please, in the next week, ask the Lord what contribution you can and ought to make to our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land. In this way, when the Good Friday Collection is taken up on Good Friday, may you contribute toward it.

THE VERB by Msgr. Kurwicki

HOLY WEEK 2017– The Week of Salvation. This annual commemoration of the central events in the history of our Redemption is a subject to vast in its scope and importance that one almost hesitates to attempt to write about it. In a true sense, all human history, past, present and future, converges upon these next seven days. The whole life of the Roman Catholic Church, of grace and the sacraments flow from the unfolding Paschal mystery. Nearly 2,000 years of Christian art, literature, music and poetry testify to this fact and mystery.

How can we make Holy Week special this year? The first way is to go to confession and experience peace and forgiveness. Our Parish penance service is Palm Sunday at 2:00 p.m. On Monday, April 10, it will be at St. Peter at 7:00 p.m. and Tuesday April 11, it will be at Immaculate Conception at 7:00 p.m. Our Cathedral also extends the unique additional opportunity for this sacrament on Good Friday afternoon at 3:30 p.m. and on Holy Saturday afternoon at 4:00 p.m. It is never too late to make a good confession.

The second opportunity is to spend time in quiet Eucharistic Adoration on Holy Thursday night following the Mass of the Lord's Supper in our parish. This vast and rich treasure is seldom used. Don't miss it this year! Our adoration is held in the daily Mass chapel until midnight. A beautiful practice is to travel from church to church to pray in various parishes on this special night. Join prayers with our neighbors to praise God for the gifts of the Most Holy Eucharist and the Holy Priesthood.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Most of us know today as Palm Sunday, although officially in the Church it is called Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, and to many Church leaders it is simply Passion Sunday, which comes from the Latin name for it, Dominica Passionis. We have reflected on this day previously how the liturgy begins with great joy and becomes more and more somber with the reading of the Passion. During the procession of the palms Jesus arrives in Jerusalem to great tumult and rejoicing as the people cry out "Hosanna... blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, hosanna in the highest." As the Mass progresses we get an overview of what is to occur during this holiest of weeks, including the institution of the Eucharist, the passion and death of the Lord, the prediction of His Resurrection, and then His Resurrection itself. Imagine the confusion of the Twelve Apostles. Jesus has been spending time with them in the recent weeks prior to the Passion trying to get them to understand that His time of suffering was near and approaching, and that is the reason He must go to Jerusalem. And here is the crowd welcoming and praising and laughing and celebrating His presence. We are not much different in many ways, but now is the time for us to really embrace and understand the sacrifice the Lord made for each of us, and the incredible gift He has given us. In the coming days it is our final chance to truly rededicate ourselves to being His disciple..- catholicsteward.com



DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY DEVOTION

On May 5th, 2000 Pope John Paul II willed that the Second Sunday of Easter would be named Divine Mercy Sunday. In his decree he has offered a plenary indulgence to those who will remember this day of grace by following the norms of the devotion to Divine Mercy Sunday. We will have a prayer service at the cathedral on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 23rd at 4:30 p.m. However in order to complete the devotion one must receive Holy Communion preferably on the same day and have sacramental confession as close to the day as possible, but not outside 20 days before or after the day. These will need to be attended to prior to the 4:30 p.m. prayer service. At this service we will complete the other norms for the devotion. We will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and offer prayers for the intention of the Holy Father. We will conclude with Benediction. Though it is not a requirement, praying the Novena to Divine Mercy is a wonderful way to prepare for this special day of grace. Note that the first day of the Novena is Good Friday.
