As an Easter Meditation, after Holy Communion we will sing in Latin, recalling Pope Benedict's letter on the liturgy,

REGINA COELI (QUEEN OF HEAVEN). The opening words of the Eastertide anthem of the Blessed Virgin, the recitation of which is prescribed in the Roman Breviary from Holy Saturday until Pentecost. It goes as follows:

Regina Coeli, laetare, alleluia: Queen of Heaven ,rejoice, alleluia;

Quia quem meruisti portare, For He whom you merited to bear, alleluia.

Resurrexit, sicut dixit, alleluia. Has risen ,as He said, alleluia.

Ora pro nobis Deum, alleluia. Pray for us to God, alleluia.

The authorship of the "Regina Coeli" being unknown, legend says that Pope St. Gregory the Great (d. 604)heard the first three lines changed by Holy Angels on Easter morning in Rome while he walked barefoot in a solemn religious procession and that the Saint himself thereupon added the fourth line.

UPDATE ON THE CARMELITES

Our two Carmelite Sisters have relocated and are settled in. They reside at 1106 Swifts Hwy. Jefferson City, MO. 65109. You may reach them by phone at: (573) 636-3430. You are encouraged to make your prayer requests known to them via mail or phone. The Sisters will be members of our Cathedral parish. During the week days they will be going to morning Mass at Helias Catholic High School. They will join the Cathedral parish for weekend Masses, but at various times join the Hispanic community for Mass at St. Peter's. Their residence is small, but adequately meets their needs. Their daily life will continue to be comprised of prayer for our diocese, quiet contemplation, enrollments and regular household activities. The house includes a small chapel, three bedrooms, small work area, kitchen and combined dining/living room area. The layout of the structure is not conducive to an open house as most of it is their private living quarters. The Sisters are grateful to be among us and promise their prayers and sacrifices for us.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY DEVOTION

On May 5th, 2000 Pope St. John Paul II willed that the Second Sunday of Easter would be named Divine Mercy Sunday. In his decree he has offered a plenary indulgence to those who will remember this day of grace by following the norms of the devotion to Divine Mercy Sunday. We will have a prayer service at the Cathedral on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 23rd at 4:30 p.m. However in order to complete the devotion one must receive Holy Communion preferably on the same day and have sacramental confession as close to the day as possible, but not outside 20 days before or after the day. These will need to be attended to prior to the 4:30 p.m. prayer service. At this service we will complete the other norms for the devotion. We will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and offer prayers for the intention of the Holy Father. We will conclude with Benediction. Though it is not a requirement, praying the Novena to Divine Mercy is a wonderful way to prepare for this special day of grace. Note that the first day of the Novena is Good Friday.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

It is Easter! Today is a day of great joy for us as Catholics. The joy is reflected all around us in the way that people are dressed, in the way they approach Mass on this day. They key for us today is to carry that joy away from Mass to our celebrations and our lives. We hear about similar joy in today's Gospel from St. John. When Mary of Magdala goes to the tomb and discovers it empty, she does not walk leisurely back to tell the others. She runs, filled with excitement and with the same joy we must feel. Joy is contagious. That is what we need to spread when we go forth on this glorious day. Easter for us should be an encounter with the Risen Lord. We are to share the Good News. That is what Mary of Magdala does. Perhaps we have a difficult time talking about the joy we feel at Easter and at other times in the Church. We should not be hesitant; sharing the joy is part of being a disciple of Christ; it is what makes us an "Easter people." All of the Gospels tell of the Resurrection of Christ. They may differ in some details, but they all agree that Christ is Risen. When His Apostles go forth to spread the Good News, they speak of His Resurrection, not the empty tomb. That is what we need to do, what we need to share — the Easter joy of being a Catholic and a Christian.- catholicsteward.com


