STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today is the Solemnity of Pentecost. One of the most ancient feasts of the Church, Pentecost is mentioned and explained in both the Acts of the Apostles (today's First Reading) and in St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. The name comes quite simply from the Greek word, Pentekoste, which meant "the 50th day" as Pentecost is 50 days after Easter Sunday (counting Easter).

Pentecost is often called the "birthday of the Church" as it was on this day — with the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and about 120 followers of Christ, including our Blessed Mother Mary and other men and women — that Christ's mission on earth is completed.

However, that mission continues with us. We, too, have received the power of the Holy Spirit through Baptism, Confirmation, the Eucharist, and other sacraments. It is this Holy Spirit that allows us to be the Lord's Disciples actively working in today's Church and today's society. Nevertheless, we must accept and recognize that fact.

In a homily given on Pentecost Sunday 20 years ago Pope St. John Paul II said, "In the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke describes the extraordinary manifestation of the Holy Spirit. This divine gift is light and power, light to proclaim the Gospel truth and power to infuse each of us with the courage of witnessing to the faith." Living out this call is the essence of stewardship. —catholicsteward.com

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

In case of a **weather emergency** during Mass, the weather siren will warn the priest of the situation. The priest will then advise the congregation to seek shelter in the undercroft. The ushers shall assist in directing the congregation seeking shelter. Once it is determined to be safe, the congregation will be directed back to the nave of the Cathedral and will be either dismissed or the Mass will be completed, depending on how much time has passed.

In the event of a fire which would require the evacuation of the building, the priest will direct the congregants to evacuate the premises. The ushers will assist the faithful in the evacuation. Congregants shall be directed to the parking lot. No attempt should be made to move vehicles in the immediate vicinity of the Cathedral (unless directed by the appropriate authorities).

THE VERB

COME, HOLY GHOST, CREATOR BLEST AND IN OUR HEARTS TAKE UP THY REST, COME WITH THY GRACE AND HEAVENLY AID, TO FILL THE HEARTS WHICH THOU HAST MADE, AMEN



This weekend, during this Jubilee Year of Mercy, we celebrate the beautiful Solemnity of Pentecost—the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Eleven Holy Apostles and Blessed Virgin Mary in the form of tongues of fire in Jerusalem. Whereas the Eleven Apostles seemed to be weak, timid, and powerless before, now they were strengthened, emboldened and equipped to enter into the world and spread their authentic witness to the resurrection of Jesus

Pentecost is also a great day of rejoicing for the Holy Church, because it is Her Birthday. The Holy Spirit has been poured out, and divine life has been granted to human hearts. During the Eucharist on Sundays and Holy Days we pray, "I believe in the Holy Sprit, the Lord, the giver of life." St. Thomas Aquinas wrote that "gift" is the Holy Spirit's proper name, as the Holy Spirit is the greatest gift of the Father and the Son to the world. We will meditate on this mystery next Sunday when we honor the Most Holy Trinity.

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord.

The twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit are Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness Goodness, Generosity, Gentleness, Faithfulness, Modesty, Self-Control, and Chastity.

Pentecost is a Greek word meaning "fiftieth". Pentecost is the fiftieth day of the Easter Season and its conclusion. For the ancient Jews, Passover marked their liberation from slavery in Egypt. Their Pentecost served as a memorial of the occasion, fifty days after the Passover, when at Mount Sinai God gave them the Ten Commandments. For us, Easter is the new Pasch, our liberation from the bondage of sin and death; Pentecost, fifty days after Easter, honors the memory of the descent of the Holy Spirit, the new law of love.

Finally, I hope this Mass today will reveal to you that Pentecost is not just a reminder of some moment in ancient church history but, an incentive to open up to the presence and power of the Holy Spirit now! We should ask, if not plead, to God for some of the energy and life that descended upon the early church. God is meant to be present in our lives each day, like fire, like a powerful wind! I pray daily that the Holy Spirit will set us on fire and give us a future filled with power and purpose.
