FLOOD RELIEFSECOND COLLECTION

A powerful storm system brought torrential rainfall and historic flooding to Missouri from Friday night, April 28 through Thursday, May 4, 2017. Areas of south central Missouri received from 10 to around 12 total inches of rainfall. This resulted in widespread and historic flooding. Numerous roads, bridges and buildings were destroyed. Many roads were flooded through the event including state highways and Interstate 44 and Interstate 55 in east central Missouri. Catholic Charities of Central and Northern Missouri have been involved in initial relief efforts, including attendance at a Multi-Agency Resource Center in St. Robert on May 9th. Numerous households throughout the Diocese of Jefferson City have been impacted by these floods and will need both short and long-term assistance in their recovery efforts. In response to these needs a second collection for the weekend of June 10-11 has been approved, to provide emergency and longer-term assistance to those affected throughout our Diocese. THE VERB

COME, HOLY GHOST, CREATOR BLEST AND IN OUR HEARTS TAKE UP THY REST, COME WITH THY GRACE AND HEAVENLY AID, TO FILL THE HEARTS WHICH THOU HAST MADE. AMEN



This weekend, we celebrate the beautiful Solemnity of Pentecost—the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Eleven Holy Apostles and Blessed Virgin Mary in the form of tongues of fire in Jerusalem. Whereas the Eleven Apostles seemed to be weak, timid, and powerless before, now they were strengthened, emboldened and equipped to enter into the world and spread their authentic witness to the resurrection of Jesus.

Pentecost is also a great day of rejoicing for the Holy Church, because it is Her Birthday. The Holy Spirit has been poured out, and divine life has been granted to human hearts. During the Eucharist on Sundays and Holy Days we pray, "I believe in the Holy Sprit, the Lord, the giver of life." St. Thomas Aquinas wrote that "gift" is the Holy Spirit's proper name, as the Holy Spirit is the greatest gift of the Father and the Son to the world. We will meditate on this mystery next Sunday when we honor the Most Holy Trinity.

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, and Fear of the Lord.

The twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit are Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness Goodness, Generosity, Gentleness, Faithfulness, Modesty, Self-Control, and Chastity.

Pentecost is a Greek word meaning "fiftieth". Pentecost is the fiftieth day of the Easter Season and its conclusion. For the ancient Jews, Passover marked their liberation from slavery in Egypt. Their Pentecost served as a memorial of the occasion, fifty days after the Passover, when at Mount Sinai God gave them the Ten Commandments. For us, Easter is the new Pasch, our liberation from the bondage of sin and death; Pentecost, fifty days after Easter, honors the memory of the descent of the Holy Spirit, the new law of love.

Finally, I hope this Mass today will reveal to you that Pentecost is not just a reminder of some moment in ancient church history but, an incentive to open up to the presence and power of the Holy Spirit now! We should ask, if not plead, to God for some of the energy and life that descended upon the early church. God is meant to be present in our lives each day, like fire, like a powerful wind! I pray daily that the Holy Spirit will set us on fire and give us a future filled with power and purpose.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today, Pentecost Sunday, is called by many the birthday of the Church. Not only does the Lord imbue His followers and Apostles with the Holy Spirit, but He sends them out into the world to accomplish and further His mission. There are strong connections to the concept of stewardship throughout the readings on this day, including the statement by St. Paul in his letter to the Corinthians, "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." That is a prompt to us that we are gifted in different ways, but we are to be willing to use those gifts to assist and support the Church and others. Nevertheless, in the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles is also a reminder to us about living a stewardship way of life. They are celebrating Pentecost, 50 days after Passover (which, for us, is Easter). Passover (as reported in the Book of Numbers in the Old Testament) was a time when the first sheaf reaped from the barley harvest was presented to God; however, at Pentecost the first fruits of the wheat harvest were given to God. This concept of giving the first fruits to God is at the heart of stewardship. How do we share the bounty that has been given us? The people of Jesus' time were deeply conscious of all their gifts, including the gifts of the earth. Everything we have comes from God. This is a day to contemplate that and to respond to it." <u>- catholicsteward.com</u>
