MY CATHOLIC EDUCATION AT ST. JOSEPH CATHEDRAL SCHOOL

The following essay was written by Linsey Byers, a recent graduate of the Cathedral School.

When I think about leaving Cathedral of St Joseph School and moving onto high school, I remember the past 9 years I've spent here, all the way back to Kindergarten and now in the last coming weeks of our 8th grade year. I remember the freeze tag that we'd play on the playground, or the disagreeing about a play in P.E., the fun times we had and also the bad times. Then we got older and a little more mature, we started making real connections with each other and with ourselves. Piece by piece we found out what it is like being Catholic and finding out more about each other. Our class grew together and we grew in our faith. From all the school masses we have attended, adoration hours we have spent, and prayers we have repeatedly said we know we have grown in more faith than our 6 year old little self just receiving our very first bible. We have many memories of our years here at St. Joseph Cathedral School, it has helped pave a path for our years down the road and guide us to our ultimate goal, heaven. As we continue to grow in our faith, St Joseph will always be our starting block. We still have a ton to grow and learn in our faith, but St. Joseph will always be where it all started, where we began to learn about God and try to grow closer to him.

My memories from being at St. Joseph will always guide me to be closer to Christ. I first came here with a young child's relationship with God. At 6 years old my dad was in a horrendous accident and was in a coma. At the time I really had no idea what to think, I had no idea why this happened to my family and I was mad at the whole world, including God. I needed to find someone to blame and why not the man who controls it all? One year and one day later my dad was diagnosed with colon cancer. This led to another decline of my relationship with God which was hard to repair. I then started my nine year journey here and began to fix the relationship. I carried what I learned from St. Joseph with me and it helped me glue the pieces of relationship with God back together. I had really strayed away from God for a long time, just going through the motions and going to church never really giving a thought about God and my relationship with him.

Coming into my junior high there was nothing really different, I was still going through the motions until attending the Luke 18 retreat. Luke 18 was the first time I made a real connection with God. There, I experienced the first real talks about God and the relationship I had. They were meaningful. We had actual real talks with other people and heard some high schoolers stories and how they were able to find God. We were able to find God in our lives that we had never really seen or looked for before.

Then came the NET retreat, this allowed us to be open about our stories and get closer to our family. It's something that stuck with us and that we will never forget. NET made us think harder about God, it really made us open about ourselves and our relationship with God. It was the best experience I've had here, it is something I will always think about when I think St. Joseph and how it shaped my faith. The NET retreat was fun for us, they made it easier to have fun with God and to learn about how to be truly happy with a relationship with God.

St. Joseph will always have a place in my heart and is the place where I grew my roots in a relationship with God. Our faith is like a house being built, we start off with the base or the floor which is baptism, this is where our path begins with God. Next the walls, this reminds me of our first Holy Communion, it gave us the power to let Christ in ourselves, in our heart. The windows are like all the masses we went to because we were able to see the bread and wine become Christ's body and blood right in front of our eyes every week. We are still building our house, the roof is when it will be complete, when we reach heaven. That has been our main goal ever since we were baptized and ever since we got into a real relationship with God, when we started to find him in our lives and love him with our hearts.

As I look back at the memories I have with St. Joseph School and with all my classmates, I see truly how lucky I am and how lucky we all are to go to such a great school. Again, the memories are something we will always have to hold and hopefully we will all cherish them forever. I think about my first confession, all the masses and adorations and think about how blessed I am even though I couldn't see that sometimes. St. Joseph has allowed me to open my eyes to see God and all his good works he has done for. My relationship with God has helped me get through even the hardest times and will only get stronger because I can continue to do the things I've learned here. I am truly grateful for what this school has taught me and I will try to carry on all that it has given me and continue my strong relationship with God.



STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

"In the Gospel of Matthew 28:19 we hear Jesus instruct his Apostles, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." This is, of course, one of many references in Holy Scripture to the Holy Trinity which we celebrate on this Solemnity today. When we receive the Eucharist at Mass, we are receiving more than the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Jesus Christ; we are also receiving the Father and the Holy Spirit because they are all One. This concept of Three Persons in one God is surely a mystery beyond our comprehension. We take this belief on faith as part of our Catholic beliefs because our human brains can never fully understand it. We received the Holy Spirit when we were confirmed, but we also received the Father and the Son. When we look at the Tabernacle which is in every Catholic Church throughout the world, we know that Christ is present, but the Father and the Holy Spirit are as well. They all dwell in heaven which means that our Tabernacle might be called a "gateway to heaven." Do we think of all this when we come into the church, when we attend Mass? We should. The Holy Trinity is present there every hour of every day and every day of every month and every year. That is one of the reasons we need to attend Mass — to understand and celebrate the Holy Trinity. - catholicsteward.com

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

In case of a **weather emergency** during Mass, the weather siren will warn the priest of the situation. The priest will then advise the congregation to seek shelter in the undercroft. The ushers shall assist in directing the congregation seeking shelter. Once it is determined to be safe, the congregation will be directed back to the nave of the Cathedral and will be either dismissed or the Mass will be completed, depending on how much time has passed. In the event of a fire which would require the evacuation of the building, the priest will direct the congregants to evacuate the premises. The ushers will assist the faithful in the evacuation. Congregants shall be directed to the parking lot. **No attempt should be made to move vehicles in the immediate vicinity of the Cathedral (unless directed by appropriate authorities).**
