#### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

"No one who sets a hand to the plow, and looks to what was left behind is fit for the Kingdom of God." Jesus was fond of using agricultural terms and images when teaching His Apostles and His followers, and this quote, which comes at the end of our Gospel Reading from Luke today, is an excellent example of that.

In fact, you almost have to have had experience with farming and plowing to understand what it means. It is important for the health and sustenance of crops that the furrows made by a plow, and in which the seeds will be planted, are straight. Whether plowing in Jesus' time either by hand or with a plow pulled by oxen, in order to plow straight rows, someone had to focus on where he was going, not on where he had been. It has not changed with our modern farm equipment today.

In other words, the secret is to look forward, and to assure that you are going in a straight line. Looking back invariably made the person plowing lose focus. That is Jesus' point to us. As good stewards we must keep our focus on Him, on following Him, and on being His disciple. That allows us to move toward our goal of holiness and of being the kind of disciple He wants us to be.-catholicsteward.com

### THE VERB

#### O Felix Roma—O Happy Rome!

Wednesday, June 29th liturgy proclaims the blessed martyrdom of the Most Holy Apostles Peter & Paul. Through the memorial of these deaths we celebrate their lives. Death is, in fact, not merely the end of life, but its fulfilment within the limits of time, within the confines of history. It is like the ultimate seal impressed upon the entire earthly existence of the person.

Thus the death of the great Apostles Peter & Paul in Rome proclaims the story of their life at the same time. This life—the life of each of them — was extraordinary in its relationship with Christ who called them to follow him. He called Simon, Son of Jonah, who was a fisherman in Galilee, and He gave him the name of Peter, that is "Rock". He called Saul of Tarsus, a persecutor of Christians, and he changed him into Paul, the Apostle of the nations, the "chosen instrument" (Acts 9: 15).

The life of each of them is thus extraordinary for the power of the Holy Spirit who enabled them to witness to Christ crucified and risen. "He will bear witness to me; and you also are my witnesses" (John 15: 26-27).

The cruel death which each of them underwent in Rome at the time of Nero was the last word of their testimony. It was determined in its complete totality.

Because of their deaths as martyrs their lives have a special place in the memory of the Church. They remain, most of all, in God who "is not God of the dead, but of the living" (Matthew 22: 32); in God in whom "everything lives".

If today's liturgy speaks of Rome in this manner, it does so especially because of the death of the Apostles.

You are blessed, Rome, because you prepared the deaths which consolidate the witness of Life. Behold, you have become a new plateau of "the great things of God" (Magnalia Dei). To you, capital of the Caesars, came Simon Peter, poor fisherman of Galilee, guided by the invisible hand of the Lord of history. Later, to you came Paul as well, the tireless apostle of Christ, the Spouse of the Church.

The great poet (Norwid) remarked that the word "Roma" (Rome) read backwards is the "Amor" (Love).

O Rome, ancient capital of the world! You were cruel to many generations of Christians. You made the first Apostles of Christ martyrs.

Yet, in your name is consolidated the truth about love, which is greater than all cruelties, tortures and persecutions, greater than death itself.

For this reason the liturgy speaks of you, "O Felix Roma!". To-day we rejoice in your election by the Lord of history and the Spouse of the Church. Furthermore, all of us, gathered at the tombs of the Holy Apostles of Christ, Peter & Paul, pray that "your faith may not fail" (Luke 22:32).

Be converted, always be converted!

And when converted, strengthen your brothers and sisters!


