STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

In Today's Gospel, Jesus and His Apostles are on their way to Jerusalem for Passover. In other words He is journeying to His Crucifixion and Resurrection. It is important for us to keep that in mind. He stops in Bethany to visit Martha and Mary. Bethany is only two miles from Jerusalem, so there is a strong sense of foreboding if we keep that in mind.

However, the focus of this reading is on many other issues and items usually. Nevertheless, as is always the case in Holy Scripture, there is a stewardship message for us here. We could cite hospitality as both Martha and Mary in their own ways welcome Jesus and make Him at ease.

The first and main message for us is that the Lord was welcomed into their home. Each of us is a potential home for Jesus. Do we welcome Him? Or are we too busy with our own pursuits, our own distractions, to find a time each day to welcome the Lord into our homes, our very being? There are so many people who cannot seem to find time for the Lord. They are so busy that Jesus never even gets into their houses. Rather than debate whether Martha or Mary do the right thing, we should first make sure that our Savior is welcomed into our hearts each and every day.

A NOTE FROM FR. DUNCAN

Hello Parishioners of the Cathedral of St. Joseph!

What a great gift and honor it is to be assigned to the Cathedral of St. Joseph as the Parochial Vicar (Associate Pastor) to serve all of you and Rev. Msgr. Kurwicki! As you may have known, I was recently ordained to the Holy Priesthood of Jesus Christ -June 4, 2016 - here at this Cathedral by our Bishop, John Gaydos. This comes after spending six years in seminary formation both at Conception Seminary College (2 years) and Kenrick-Glennon School of Theology (4 years). I spent my last year in seminary as a transitional deacon assigned to St. George, Hermann; and Church of the Risen Savior, Rhineland. With this assignment is included the Shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows (Starkenburg), which is a place very dear to me - and worth going to visit if you have not been! I grew up always just outside of Jefferson City (mainly near Wardsville); however, I have been a life-long member and received many of my sacraments at Immaculate Conception parish on the east side of town. My parents and three younger siblings all reside in the Jefferson City area. I attended Immaculate Conception grade school (K-8), Helias Catholic High School (Class of 2007), and University of Missouri -Columbia (Mizzou) for three years prior to entering seminary. I am pleased that our Bishop has assigned me here at the "Great" Cathedral as my first assignment to begin my priestly ministry. I greatly look forward to this learning experience, and I humbly ask for your prayers and your patience with me as I strive with the help of God to be your Associate Pastor. It has been a great experience here so far and I look forward my time to come. Please know that I am here for all of you and that I desire to draw each of you to the Sacred Heart of our Lord, through the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Ad Iesu Per Mariam! (To Jesus through Mary!) May God continue to bless each of you and your families!
