The policy of the Bishop is that every Catholic home in the Diocese should receive the paper, then the parish is billed for the subscription. Please use the envelopes for the Catholic Missourian that is in your monthly packet to pay your subscription. The cost is \$14 per year. The bill for the Cathedral last year was \$18,410. We expect the bill to be the same this year. So far we have only collected \$4,048.00 this year! The remainder will have to be paid from general revenue which takes away from extra social projects and school events. Please help us!

## **STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION**

Jesus presents us with more parables in today's Gospel from St. Matthew. He opens the first one with "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and hid; and for joy over it he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." According to most biblical scholars and theologians who study and draw conclusions on Jesus' teachings, in this particular parable, and those which follow, the field is the world. The man who values the treasure is not any of us because we do not have anything with which to purchase this treasure. The Man Who gave all to buy this field was Jesus Himself. And it is with joy that He gives all to buy the field, to save the world and each of us. What makes the treasure so wonderful that the Lord would give all, His very life? Each of us. In other words, each of you! Jesus gave everything to redeem the whole world to preserve a treasure it contains. He gave all because we His people are the treasure. Do we understand that? Do we consider that every time we approach the gift of the Eucharist? We should. St. Paul may have put it best in his letter to the Romans: "You are loved more than you will ever know, by someone who died to know you." (Romans 5:8) catholicsteward.com

## LITURGICAL ETIQUETTE

External gestures of reverence can become a witness to the truths of our faith. For this reason, we wish to remind our guests and parishioners of habits or practices which are not appropriate. -The rule of fasting from solid food for an hour before one receives the Eucharist still holds, and thus makes the **chewing of gum** in church completely disrespectful and inappropriate.

-Although the Church does not require everyone to be dressed in their "Easter finest" every week for Mass, please remember that the way we dress for church is, oftentimes, a sign of how important the celebration of the Eucharist is to us. Overly revealing clothing or bare midriffs are never appropriate.

-Churches are meant to be sacred space, places where all can pray and worship. While a cordial greeting is never out of place, carrying on an audible and protracted conversation is never appropriate.

-External gestures of reverence can become a witness to the truths of our faith. The bow immediately before receiving Holy Communion should be done with the conscious recognition that it is the Lord Himself before Whom we bow. He is truly present in the Eucharist, in both the host and the cup, and the extension of the hand must acknowledge our acceptance of a gift, not a grabbing for something owed us. The hands are completely empty, extended in the gesture of acceptance. **The Lord should not be just another item among keys or other personal items**.

-Our spoken and sung responses at Mass are always meant to be done communally, with whatever abilities were bestowed on us by our Father. What is believed and held in our hearts ought to be expressed outwardly during the Mass **in word and music**.

-Finally, out of respect and reverence for the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, **arriving at Mass on time and remaining until the priest has recessed down the aisle is appropriate behavior.** Leaving Mass early and disturbing the flow of communion in order to exit is never appropriate. Please place cell phones on silent and remain in church until the end of Mass to be blessed and commissioned to go forth in Christ's name. -July 11, 2010 Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis Bulletin

"Full, conscious, and active participation" in the Liturgy (as commended by the Second Vatican Council) is not only their right but also their duty and their responsibility. That responsibility includes full engagement throughout the liturgical celebration. When we play our roles in the Liturgy with our bodies, minds, and hearts fully engaged, we make to God a perfect sacrifice of praise.


