STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

The Book of Daniel, from which our First Reading is drawn, was written some two centuries before the birth of Christ. This is only significant in that many of the prophets (Daniel is considered one of the major prophets) lived as many as six centuries before Christ. However, regardless the timeline, we need to be moved by and appreciative of the prophecies we find in the Old Testament. In the particular passage in today's reading it states, "The one like a Son of Man received dominion, glory, and kingship." Today, of course, is the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, and this reading very much parallels what is portrayed in the Transfiguration. The interesting point within this reading from Daniel, however, is that it refers to the "Son of Man," which is the term Jesus Himself used most often to describe Himself. We have referenced this fact previously. In fact, the term "Son of Man" occurs 85 times in the Gospels, and in 83 of them it is Jesus who uses the term. (It appears 32 times in Matthew; 15 times in Mark; 26 times in Luke; and 12 times in John, and it is in John where it is used twice by someone other than Jesus.) The important point for us is that Jesus calling Himself the Son of Man explains that He was born of a woman, and He shares in our earthly conditions and sufferings. That fact should make us want to embrace Him as our Savior, our Friend, and our Shepherd even more. catholicsteward.com

Back to School: They academic year will begin at the Cathedral School on August 16. This is another blessed opportunity for us to form young minds and hearts after the fashion of Jesus Christ and to hand down the faith which He has given to us. Our school motto is crystal clear, "We are disciples of Christ and fishers of men." As school begins please remember to slow down in the parish parking lot and to be vigilant about children darting between parked cars. This past spring I had the opportunity to attend for the very first time the NCEA convention. It was held in St. Louis and so myself and Fr. Duncan along with all of our teachers were able to see and experience along with 3000 other people the blessings and challenges of having a parish grade school. You need to know that we are doing many things correctly and our programs are set properly and in accordance with the teaching of our church. I was so proud to hear when I visited the display booths that our teachers had been there before me and had left a very positive impression upon all the people they encountered. Please pray for a successful school year. Support our school!

Mass Times and Priest Changes: Our neighbors at Immaculate Conception and St. Peters are now down to only two priests per parish. Immaculate Conception has 1800 households and St. Peters almost the same amount. We have 1500 households. Their parish councils recommended that they review the number of Masses offered during the weekend and both parishes are reducing them. St. Peters will go from six Masses to four and Immaculate Conception will reduce their schedule by one. We have no plans to change or alter our weekend Mass times here at the Cathedral. We have posted the new Mass times and effective dates of our neighboring parishes in the side column. Total Solar Eclipse: It's going to be dark around here on August 21. It is being billed as the "celestial event of the century "in Jefferson City as a historic total solar eclipse will occur. Beginning at 11:46 a.m. and ending at 2:41 p.m. The peak will be at 1:12 p.m. The city is expecting 50,000 visitors that day and our school will be having special events concerning it. People need to obtain the special viewing glasses in order that damage is not done to your eyes. I read somewhere that the last total solar eclipse occurred in this area in 1257. I remind everyone that there will be special events by NASA on the grounds of the capitol and people need to plan ahead for extra traffic all through out the city and when picking up children from school.

Cathedral Rectory Update: Msgr. Lammers and Fr. Schrader has completely moved in to their suites. They are unpacked and happy as well as eager to serve the Cathedral parish. Fr. 
