## **STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION**

Today's Gospel from the Book of Matthew describes what occurred in Tyre and Sidon when Jesus cured the daughter of a Gentile woman. Tyre and Sidon were Gentile cities. The Apostles faithfully followed the Lord wherever He went, just as we are called to do. There was only one reason that the Lord made this trip (on foot, of course, as that was the only alternative at that time), and that was to cure the daughter of the Gentile woman. Making an effort like that is a sign of Christ's love, and His understanding of a need. He was also trying to teach His followers, which includes us, how important each individual and her or his faith is. Jesus' Apostles found this situation, and perhaps even this entire trip, to be a fruitless and empty gesture, more of a bother than it was worth. They even plead with Jesus to ignore the woman and send her away. They said, "Send her away, for she keeps calling out after us." However, Jesus is teaching a lesson to each of us, actually two lessons. He does not "send her away" but finally responds, saying "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." The two lessons (messages) Jesus provides to us are easily summarized. First, we need to know and understand that Jesus loves us and He is aware of our needs. The second is that when we pray and appeal for help (all the woman finally said was "Lord, help me!") a key to answered prayers is persistence. ## A NOTE FROM RYAN BAX

Greetings St. Joseph Cathedral Parishioners,

My name is Ryan Bax, and I've been a parishioner at SJC parish for six years now. I'm writing to announce that I will be attending Conception Seminary College this fall to begin my studies towards becoming a diocesan priest for the Diocese of Jefferson City. I'm excited for this next step in my life and ask for your prayers moving forward! I was born and raised in Jefferson City and, aside from some time away at college, have lived here my whole life. I am the second son (of four) to Doug and Kimie Bax. My brothers are David, Adam, and Nathan. You may know us as that tall family who goes to 11am Mass on a regular basis.

I attended St. Peter's grade school, Helias Catholic High School, and then Benedictine College. It was the summer after graduating from high school that my family and I joined St. Joseph Cathedral parish. Joining SJC parish played an important role in my discernment to attend seminary. After graduating college, I found a job as an engineer for ABB. Making this transition from college to working a full-time job was a challenging time in my life. During this tough transition, I met a handful of times with Fr. Chris Aubuchon for support and spiritual direction. These meetings were very fruitful, and I'm very grateful for them! At the end of Fr. Aubuchon's time at SJC, Father Josh Duncan was ordained a priest and assigned to SJC parish as the associate pastor. Over the past year, Father Duncan and I have become good friends. In our friendship, Fr. Duncan has played a very influential role in my life by, not only being a friend, but also by showing me glimpses into the beauty of the priesthood. Although I've struggled with this call from God to go to seminary for many years now, through Thursday night JCYA (Jefferson City Young Adults) Masses, Frassati Fraternity meetings with local high schoolers, and late night discussions on our Catholic faith, God has worked through Father Duncan to show me that priesthood is a beautiful way to be God's hands and feet, acting "in persona Christi" (in the person of Christ). Discovering this beauty has kick-started my desire to go to seminary. I'd also like to give thanks to Fr. Joseph Minuth, a Dominican priest, for our monthly spiritual direction meetings in Columbia at the Newman Center on Mizzou's Campus over the past year. His guidance has been huge in my discernment. As I mentioned above, I'm excited about this next step in my life and ask for your prayers moving forward. I ask you to pray that God continues to show me the beauty of the priesthood, that He grants me the graces to make a good discernment, and, in the end, that I receive the necessary clarity to choose His will above all else.
