#### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

"For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last" (Luke 13:30). With those words Jesus makes it clear to us that there are no lines, no privileges in heaven.

Today's Gospel from the Book of Luke — in fact all of our readings for today, this 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time — have to do with salvation. It is difficult to be faithful and Catholic without thinking about heaven on occasion, and the Lord and St. Paul often in his letters, remind us over and over that we are to be striving for that — that our thoughts should be as much on the next life as on this one. Yet when we hear that Gospel that the first will be last and the last will be first, we may think there is some lack of justice there.

Jesus does not state this as a definite. He actually is telling us that the first may be last and the last may be first. The truth is that it really is not important. Our faith, the Lord, our sense of stewardship repeatedly remind us that what we think is important on earth may not be important in heaven at all. There is a Greek proverb that says, "Being first is good, but being last is perfect." We are all called to discipleship and we need to answer that call. Responding before someone else does not make us better, but responding is very important.

#### THE VERB BY MSGR. KURWICKI

The Cathedral School creates a Christ-centered community through spiritual, academic and social growth that will provide the foundation to serve a challenging society faithfully and well. Be it known to all who enter: Christ is the reason for this school. Christ si the unseen but ever present teacher in our classes, the model of our faculty, and the inspiration of our parents and students. It's back to school time and so let's return to the basics of our faith. We believe in God, Father, Son and Spirit and the One, Holy Catholic and Apostolic faith that He established. He so loved us, that He makes us His children through baptism. St. Paul in the second reading wanted us to understand that Baptism has a profound effect on us. As baptized, we have become Christ's own so profoundly that Christ's Spirit lives in us, luring us toward all that we can become through sharing life with Him. We cannot control the Spirit, but we are free to choose how much we wish to be open to God's constant offer of grace. Since we usually baptize infants, parents commit to teach their children by their words and actions, assisted by the godparents. Parents promise to raise their children Catholic and allow the Spirits gifts to be learned and fostered in their home. All of us are to be teachers as well as learners. We are all called to be constant students of the faith. At the Cathedral School, we take up our mission of educate our youth through our parish school and our youth programs, but we also are doing more to educate and help form our adults. We, adults, are the ones who need to pass on our faith to our children. We can't teach what we don't know or understand and it all comes at a cost. The grace of our baptism must be fed by our growth in the World and the Sacraments. Let us grow together in our faith. This is what one parent shared about being "first teachers" of their child. Being "first teachers" has to begin with modeling, through our everyday lives, Christian values especially those of faith, hope and charity and by attending Mass as a family regularly and on Holy Days. Being "first teachers" is helping our children to develop a meaningful prayer life... and it's never too late to start. There are so many things and attitudes that are competing for our children's attention not to mention the popular notion that Jesus is irrelevant and that God, if he exists, is outdated. How can we help our kids learn our Catholic faith and grow in that same faith? First, we need to realize that the key to having a strong Catholic faith is to have a strong relationship with Jesus Christ. As parents, do we believe that Christ wants to be active in our everyday lives? Do we share that understanding with our children? Do we share our daily stories of encounter and conversion? Do we make daily prayer a priority? If we don't do these things, our children may never learn them. The second key is to understand and live out the mission of the Catholic Church: to love and serve our neighbor, especially the poor and vulnerable, with the same intense love that Christ has for us. Do we model an active life of service in order to help build the Kingdom of God? Do we share our blessings with those is need in our community and outside of it? It is too easy as a parent to pass on our responsibility as first teacher to others, such as grandparents, the parochial school or the parish's religious education program; but God endowed parent s to be uniquely qualified to teach their children even if they don't think they know how God will always provide the graces we need if we but ask for those graces. I pray that this school year will be a year of graces for our children. I especially keep all of our parents in my prayers; that they receive the graces they need to fulfill their responsibilities to their children.

In light of recent incidents of violence and racial tension in communities across the United States, the president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has invited all dioceses across the country to unite in a Day of Prayer for Peace in Our Communities on September. 9, the feast of St. Peter Claver. Archbishop Wilton Gregory, of Atlanta, will chair a new special task force on building peace in communities and healing racial tensions. We encourage Catholics around the country to gather on or around September. 9 to pray, reflect, and discern action steps. To help you, the USCCB racism page offers many resources, including a video, bishops' statements, prayer and liturgy resources, teaching materials, articles and more. The WeAre-SaltAndLight.org diversity and racial justice page includes additional resources. To inspire your own efforts, we are also highlighting stories about how real Catholic communities are working for peace and racial justice, including: Improving policecommunity relations, working for racial and economic justice in Dallas, Witnessing to faith and love in Ferguson, Faith transforms violence and racism in West Baltimore, Parish facilitates discussions that encounter (Minneapolis, MN), Reflecting on racism, affirming the dignity of all God's children (Savannah, GA), Living the Eucharist through encounter, racial and economic justice (New Orleans, LA), Parish celebrates diversity, forms leaders of many ethnicities (Springfield, IL), Praying and acting to fight racism and division (Washington, DC).
