Last weekend, we kicked off the 2018 Catholic Stewardship Appeal. Our parish goal is \$245,485, with the diocesan goal set at \$2,145,000. Beginning this year, Bishop McKnight has initiated a new process that will reward parishes for their success. Therefore, if the diocesan goal is met, and our Cathedral parish meets its goal, we will receive a 10% rebate check from the Diocese (\$24,549). In addition, the Diocese will return 90% of any money raised in excess of our parish goal. But, the diocesan goal must be met first, in order for them to have the funds necessary to offer these monetary rewards. So as we pray for the success of this year's CSA, please remember that we are praying for success across the entire Diocese, since we cannot carry the mission of the Church alone.

Add dry ingredients to creamed mixture. Blend thoroughly. Chill 1 hour until firm. Bring your cookie dough to the Undercroft refrigerator on Nov. 11th. Remember, we need lots of cookie dough to make lots of cookies!
