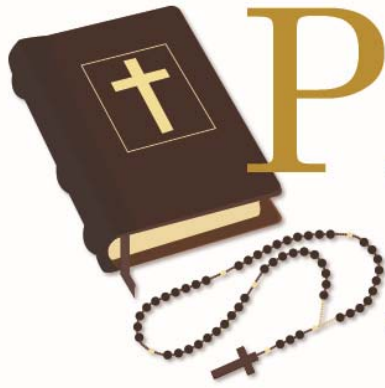

**Cookie Dough Recipe (Needed on November 11th)**

Combine: 2 3/4 cups flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt. Cream until light and fluffy: 3/4 cup soft butter (not whipped or tub margarine), 1 cup sugar, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon vanilla. Add dry ingredients to creamed mixture. Blend thoroughly. Chill 1 hour until firm. Bring your cookie dough to the Undercroft refrigerator on Nov. 11th. Remember, we need lots of cookie dough to make lots of cookies!
