<u>ALTAR SERVICE IS A PRIVILEGE AND A BLESSING</u> By Cathi Douglas, OC Catholic 10/9/2016

The celebration of the Holy Mass is like an intricate dance, with the Priest leading a flawless performance that can have few or many Co celebrante including Decease. Alter Servers Liturei

many Co-celebrants, including Deacons, Altar Servers, Liturgical minister, Eucharistic Ministers and more.

To ever Devout Catholics it appears simple, yet the Mass requires that its youngest participants fix their attention on that smallest details to ensure the ceremony flows seamlessly.

Pope Francis acknowledged the important role of altar servers during a special evening meeting and prayer that drew 9,000 youth from throughout Europe to St. Peter's Square in early August 2015, according to the National Catholic Reporter.

Serving at the altar, the Pope told the young people, is a privileged way to draw closer to Jesus, which in turn "enables you to open yourselves to others, to journey together, to set demanding goals and to find the strength to achieve them."

Participating as altar servers allows boys and girls the satisfaction of functioning as part of the liturgical team, explains Katie Dawson, director of faith formation for the Diocese of Orange.

"It's helpful for young teens and tweens to become part of the altar-serving ministry because it's the most significant way to make a meaningful contribution to the liturgy," Dawson says. "it is a concrete way of participating in the community of faith." In addition to contributing their support to the liturgical celebration, altar servers develop certain qualities through their service, Dawson notes.

- • **Responsibility.** Altar servers must memorize the Mass and commit to a regular schedule of service.
- • Punctuality. Servers are required to arrive early to each Mass in order to determine their roles, prepare items and dress in their albs.
- ♦ Attentiveness. Altar servers learn the deeper meaning behind each step of the liturgy.
- Poise. Servers must spring into action when mistakes are made. They know to step in when an item is misplaced and smooth out any rough edges during the Mass.
- Maturity. Altar service contributes to a server's maturity as they learn lessons and put their knowledge into practice.

"Altar service is an important step in a young person's contribution to the work of liturgy," Dawson says. "The term 'liturgy' actually means the work of worship, so we are teaching them the work they do in the liturgy."

Perhaps most important, Dawson notes, altar service encourages youngsters to consider others' needs before their own and encourages their contributions to the greater good. "We live in an environment where we are constantly urged to say no to service," she notes.

"We constantly hear that there are too many demands on us. SO this is a counter-cultural message: If God gives you a chance to make a contribution, it's a good thing to say yes."

PRAYER TO CHRIST THE KING

O Christ Jesus, I acknowledge You King of the universe. All that has been created, has been made for You. Make full use of Your rights over me. I renew my baptismal promises, renouncing Satan and all his pomps and works, and I promise to live a good Christian life, and to do all in my power to bring about the triumph

of the rights of God and of Your Church. Divine Heart of Jesus, I offer You my efforts so that all hearts may acknowledge Your Sacred Kingship, and that thus the Kingdom of Your peace may be established in the whole world. Amen.

The Christ the King Solemnity began with Pope Pius XI in 1925 to counter the atheism and secularism. Pius wanted to communicate the belief that Jesus is Lord of all, the King of creation. The biblical reality, however, is that Jesus is not a king like the kings of this world. These kings "lord" it over their people exercising power, at times without restraint. Jesus is Lord indeed; yet he came to serve, not to be served, and to give his life for the sake of all. A monarchical reign is not a characteristic of the Kingdom of God.

The Kingdom of God that Jesus proclaimed is one in which all people are treated with dignity, and valued for who and what they are. It is a kingdom that actively cares for the poor, the homeless, the alienated, and the oppressed, as it mobilizes to establish justice and a right relationship with all. This is what every institution that models itself on Jesus the King has to be about. As we celebrate this feast, let us pray that all institutions, especially the church, model themselves on Jesus' servant leadership. -LPI Q&A

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

We celebrate today what is popularly and traditionally called the Feast of Christ the King. This is also the beginning of the last week of our Catholic Liturgical Year, as the New Year begins with Advent next Sunday. We often mention that time is a gift to us; this idea of measuring Church time is also a gift, but do we truly appreciate it? People tend to say "I go to church." In reality, Christ does not call us to "go" to church; He calls us to be Church. We should live our lives in such a way that it is clear we are Catholic and Christian and part of Christ's Kingdom, for He is our King. Were you aware that the name "Christ" is a royal title in itself? In Greek it means "the anointed king." St. Paul referred to the Lord as "king of kings and lord of lords," a phrase with which we are familiar. If we accept Christ as our King, and if we live our lives as His disciples and followers we are certainly part of His Kingdom. Pope Pius XI instituted today's solemnity in 1925 at a time when many countries were struggling with total loyalty to secular royalty. Pius XI wanted Catholics to recognize that their loyalty was to a higher power, their spiritual king in heaven. Pius XI wrote at that time, "For Jesus Christ reigns over the minds of individuals by His teachings, in their hearts by His love, in each one's life by the living according to His law and the imitating of His example."-catholicsteward.com
