All of the good works done by the Knights of Columbus are guided by four core principles: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism.



There is no question that Jesus had a way with words. The Word of the Lord is filled with what we are very familiar with in our society - sound bites if you will, which convey so much meaning. ATTENTION: MISSOURI BIRTH PARENTS AND ADOPT-EES: Missouri adoption law is changing!

On January 1st, 2018, adult adoptees (ages 18 and older) will be granted access to their original birth certificate. Birth parents have the right to protect their confidentiality under the new law, but they *must act before January 1st*. 
