HISTORY OF THE NATIVITY SCENE



Nativity sets are a popular indoor decoration during the Christmas season; and were not always small, motionless figurines. The original nativity set was live, with people dressed as Mary and Joseph, and real animals. The first live nativity sets were said to be created

by St. Francis of Assisi in the 12th century. Traditionally, the sets were displayed at the front of medieval churches and temples. Soon artists began carving these images into wood or making them out of straw, and when the nativity sets moved to other countries like Italy, other materials were used such as stone and ivory. Many Italians commissioned the work of famous artists to hand carve and create their nativity scenes. In Rome, a large nativity scene is put out in the square of the Vatican just before Christmas, where many believers come to see its beauty.

When the town of Bethlehem, Pennsylvania was settled in America in the year 1741, the people there brought this old tradition to the United States. Originally, nativity sets in America were called crèche, which means crib in French. Many people choose a barn-like container as the background, while others prefer simpler, more natural backdrops such as rocks or grass. Many families choose to pass their nativity scenes down from one generation to the next as an heirloom gift. They have become a worldwide tradition for those wanting to celebrate the birth of Christ.

THE VERB by Msgr. Kurwicki

Advent is a great, short liturgical season. Spending only four weeks in preparation for an event that is "yet to come," but "already present," challenges us to delve ever deeper into the mystery of Incarnation. As a community of faith we are called to find something new in each Advent season, rather than go through the options of repeating something that has grown old and tired through centuries of repetition.

In late Advent, we are challenged to breathe new life and contemporary meanings into ancient texts such as the church's seven great "O Antiphons". Dating from the eight and ninth centuries, these prayerful poem-song jewels address the coming and already-among-us Messiah. These Scripture-based prayers emerged from a mix of Jewish and Christian faith communities fear, impatience and glimmering hope. They invoke Jesus by various magnificent titles passed to us in both the Old and New testament, and they prod us, disciples of today, to expand our view of "God-with-us." On the last seven days before Christmas, we pray:

(December 17) O Wisdom, O Sapientia, Who came from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from end to end and to ordering all things mightily and sweetly, COME, and teach us the way of salvation.

(December 18) O Lord, O Adonai, And Leader of the house of Israel, COME, and with outstretched arms redeem us.

(December 20) O Key of David, O Clavis David, And Scepter of the House of Israel, COME, and bring forth from his prison the captive that sitteth in the darkness and the shadow of death.

(December 21) O Radiant Dawn, O Oriens, Brightness of the light eternal, COME, and enlighten them that sit in darkness and the shadow death.

(December 22) O King of the Nations, O Rex Gentium, And the desired to them, COME, and deliver man who though didst form out of the dust of the earth.

(December 23) God-with-Us, O Emmanuel, God with us our King and Lawgiver, the expected of all nations, COME, and save us, O LORD our GOD.

ADVENT VESPERS

Come join us for Vespers this Advent Season – Sundays at 6:00 p.m. in the Cathedral. Advent is a time of joyful anticipation, so we must do all we can to prepare ourselves this season. Vespers is a beautiful way to prepare ourselves for Christmas, and to pray with and for the Church. The Liturgy of the Hours - also called the "Divine Office" - is the required prayer of every Roman Catholic cleric. Around the world, priests and religious unite in praying this Prayer of the Church. The Liturgy of the Hours is divided into seven "hours" of prayer, each involving an assortment of psalms, responsories, canticles, and readings. Vespers includes two psalms, a canticle from the New Testament, a short reading, a responsory, and the Magnificat canticle. The Liturgy of the Hours expresses the continuum from the Old Covenant to the New by incorporating the Jewish psalms with the Christian canticles in the official prayer of the Catholic Church. We had 32 people last weekend.

ADVENT ACTIVITIES 2016

With the Season of Advent we begin a new liturgical year. We enter into a new cycle of grace as we experience God's love for us and offer Him our love in return. Advent is called "a time of joyful expectation," as we long for God's promise to be fulfilled through His presence in the lives and activities of people of faith. Hopefully, we will not lose focus on this point with all the other activities of the season.

Gaudete Sunday is the Third Sunday of Advent. The Introit for Gaudete Sunday, is taken from Philippians 4:4,5: "Gaudete in Domino semper" ("Rejoice in the Lord always"). Like Lent, Advent is a penitential season, so the Priest normally wears purple vestments. But on Gaudete Sunday, having passed the midpoint of Advent, the Church lightens the mood a little, and the Priest wears rose vestments. The change in color provides us with encouragement to continue our spiritual preparation—especially prayer and fasting—for Christmas. For this same reason, the third candle of the Advent wreath, first lit on Gaudete Sunday, is traditionally rose-colored.
