


MASS INTENTIONS

Mass Intention offerings are now being accepted for the Cathedral Masses in 2020. There are open dates beginning March 22, 2020.

In 2006, The Cathedral Parish Council approved the following to be used in scheduling Mass Intentions.

- Four intentions for one person can be scheduled per year. One intention may be scheduled at a weekend Mass, and the other three would be scheduled at a weekday Mass. If a request is made for more than four intentions (memorials for the recently departed), the additional Masses can be sent to the Chancery to be offered at other parishes.
- 2. Mass Intentions will be scheduled only one year in advance. Update: Extra offerings cannot be accepted and held for Masses beyond one year.
- 3. Update: The donation for each Mass has been increased to \$10, effective July 1, 2019.


