



RCIA Information Sheet

We welcome you, as you begin the process of learning about the Roman Catholic Church. We will do all that we can to help you to learn about the Catholic Faith. The first thing we ask of you is that you complete this questionnaire.

This questionnaire is a useful tool to help us serve you better and get to know you and your particular situation. It will also help us determine in advance any impediments to your becoming a Catholic, should you choose. Each question is asked for a particular purpose, although not all questions may apply to you specifically.

Please answer fully all questions that apply to you. The questions that do not apply to you should be left blank. For the "Yes" / "No" / "Not Sure" questions, please check the appropriate box provided. If there are any questions that you do not understand or are uncomfortable with answering here, you may leave them blank and these can be discussed with either the priest assisting with RCIA or the RCIA director.

An Introduction and Explanation

To keep everyone involved from having to make difficult decisions at an inopportune time, we have created this questionnaire. Through your completion of this form and our discussion with you about certain responses, we hope to avoid any last minute surprises and deal with any issues far in advance in a proper, pastoral way.

These questions have been developed by looking at some of the awkward situations of others and then asking: How could someone have found out about this problem sooner? What question(s) should have been asked at the start of the RCIA process? There are a number of questions here, which are designed to identify and properly guide us through this process to make it as smooth and surprise-free as possible.

Your answers are personal and will be treated as confidential; they will only be seen by the RCIA director, the priest assisting with RCIA, and the Pastor of the Cathedral Parish.

Need for Sponsor and / or Godparent/s

If you will become a Roman Catholic or are already Roman Catholic but want the sacrament of Confirmation, you will need to select one person who meets the criteria below to be your Confirmation sponsor. You need only one Confirmation sponsor, and the sponsor does not need to be the same sex as you.

If you're not baptized and want to become Roman Catholic, your Confirmation sponsor can also serve as your godparent in baptism, or you can choose another person, or two persons, to serve as your godparent/s. One of the persons must be Catholic and meet the criteria below, while the other needn't be Catholic but must be a practicing and faithful Christian. Usually two persons are chosen to be godparents for a minor, but only one of each sex is permitted.

Canon 892 of the *Code of Canon Law*, 1983, states the purpose and criteria for a person to be eligible to be a confirmation sponsor:

“It is for the sponsor to see that the confirmed person acts as a true witness to Christ and faithfully fulfills the obligations connected with this sacrament.”

Essentially, the same is true for baptismal godparents except, in the case of a child, they have the additional responsibility of seeing that the child is raised in the Catholic faith in the event the child's parents were to die or be unable to care for the child.

To perform the role of Confirmation sponsor or baptismal godparent, the person/s must meet the following conditions:

1. Be designated by the one to be baptized/confirmed, or by their parents or the person who takes their place...;
2. Be at least 17 years of age;
3. Be a Catholic who:
 1. has been confirmed; and
 2. has already received the sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist; and
 3. leads a life in harmony with the Catholic faith and the role to be undertaken.
4. Not be bound by a canonical penalty (e.g., excommunication, interdiction, a priest or deacon suspended from clerical functions) legitimately imposed or declared;
5. Not be the father or mother of the one to be confirmed or baptized.

May God bless you and be with you as you journey with us. We will pray every day for you in this potentially life-changing process.

The following questions will help us to understand if there may be any impediments to your becoming a Catholic, or receiving the sacraments of Confirmation and/or Eucharist. In addition, these questions will help us determine whether your former marriage, or your spouse's former marriage, will require you or your spouse to apply for determination of whether your or your spouse's former marriage was not spiritually valid (i.e., a declaration of nullity, or annulment). The annulment process in the Catholic Church does not seek to determine whether the marriage itself was civilly legal, but rather determine whether the conditions were such that the sacrament of Matrimony actually existed within the legal marriage. Even if you are unsure whether you want to become Catholic, we encourage you to speak with the RCIA director or the priest assisting with RCIA if you have been married previously.
